Lakeshore Garden Masters-General Membership Minutes

September 23, 2019



The LGM September meeting began at 6:30pm at Hackley Public Library. There were seventeen attendees, including two guests.

Jean Baker gave a presentation titled "The Perils and Pleasures of Gardening by Catalog." She said to always do research before purchasing and also check internet sites and gardening forums. Always read the company's plant replacement policies. Jean also showed us a new container system which makes vegetables easy to grow and helps to keep them from drying out. Did you know the Walker Library in North Muskegon has a seed library?

Five seed packets can be "checked out" at a time.

The LGM business meeting followed the presentation. It is time to think about topics for the 2020 calendar. Contact the president or vice president with ideas for presentations or speakers.

Graphics House will be replacing the Monet Garden sign. Florence Bright-Stahl is generously donating \$500 towards the new sign. Funds in the Community Foundation will cover the rest. There was an affirmative vote to make the sign two-sided. Also discussed was adding Monet Garden donation information to the sign.

Susan gave a 20 for 20 Campaign update. This successful campaign is now closed. \$22,834.24 was raised by donations to the Muskegon County Community Foundation and Go Fund Me page.

Expenses include \$11,309.50 for pathways by Sellinger Contractors, \$4500 for pond renovation by Lakeshore Aquascape, \$417.89 for electrical upgrades to pond lighting, and \$400 for Monet Garden brochures. The remaining balance from this campaign is \$6206.85. The Community Foundation Fund has roughly \$7000 for our use. Future needs include Monet Garden signage, boulder engraving, 20th anniversary event, and Landscape Architect services and plant replacement.

October 21, 2019

Fifteen members attended the meeting. There was one guest, Lori Zahdeh, who decided to join LGM.

The meeting began at 6:30 pm with a presentation about the Monet Garden. Susan Thorpe showed a video taken at the Monet Garden Dedication Ceremony on June 18, 2002. Florence Bright-Stahl spoke about Muskegon's French history. She presented a new idea for the garden. When cruise ships arrive in port, we could have people in period costumes in the garden. They would share information about the garden and Muskegon's French connection. Florence also presented this idea to Muskegon's Victorian Ladies' Society.

The LGM business meeting began at 7:00 pm. Sharon Rubelman gave the Treasurer's Report. There are 33 paid members for 2019. The LGM account balance is \$4036.78, including \$985.50 of Monet Garden money.

Linda Hecksel said that thanks to Dave Mellema's service group the Monet Garden is put to bed for the winter. She is looking for a landscape designer for the garden.
